Information for Participating Scouts

Except for the Swimming clinic in March, merit badge clinics start at 9:00 am and are held at the Bothell stake center for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. The address is 16500 124th Ave N.E. Woodinville, 98072; Tel (425) 488-7070. Merit badge clinics are usually completed by 12:00 pm, although they often end earlier.

Scouts should come to these clinics having already read the merit badge requirements, and they should bring a printed merit badge workbook, a pencil or pen to write with, and a blue merit badge card signed in advance by their scoutmaster. Scouts do not need to sign-up or register in advance for the clinics.

*The Swimming Merit Badge will be held at Juanita High School Pool located at 10601 NE 132nd St. Kirkland WA. 98034. We have reserved and paid for the pool during this time. The clinic will focus on both the 1st and 2nd Class requirements for younger scouts and the swimming merit badge requirements for those that have completed the 1st and 2nd Class requirements. **Due to budget and pool restrictions, this clinic is limited to scouts in the North Lakes District only.** The merit badge requirements have changed and therefore the scouts do not need to jump into the pool with their clothes on. The pool has changing rooms.

Information for Assigned Units

Each ward/unit is assigned to organize and lead only one clinic during the year. The buildings and rooms have already been reserved by the stake. The unit listed organizes the course and instruction. The unit in charge is responsible to have a qualified merit badge counselor lead the course and to have at least one additional BSA registered adult present, preferably another merit badge counselor. The merit badge counselors do not need to be from the same unit, but they do need to be a currently registered merit badge counselor.

The merit badge clinic schedule is also posted on the North Lakes District website at the beginning of the year.
